

Mangoes on the Beach


Love.. Loss.. Separation.. and the ties that bind a family.

A one-man show based on the life of Titanic survivor, Edward Dorking.

Edward was gay. Openly gay, and on Wednesday April 10th, 1912, he set sail on a ticket bought for him by his parents in the hope his American family could put him 'right'.

Third Class charts Edward's journey of survival and how, upon arriving in New York, he toured the Vaudeville circuit, recreating the stories for a fact-hungry public.

But Edward didn't want fame; he wanted revenge. When everyone was talking about the deaths of millionaires and society figures, few were discussing the people who took the lion's share of the losses that night: the third class.

Edward was coming for the upper classes.


